I have been thinking a lot lately about prayer – what it means to pray and what it means to listen to the One to whom I pray. We often talk about unanswered prayers. I love the fact that God gives us the grace and wisdom to look back and see that, sometimes, the things for which we prayed the hardest in the past are often not the things that give us the best and brightest future. God does not always give us what we wish for, but He always gives us what we need. So many times in my life, I have looked back and seen that what I received from God was so much better than what I wanted in the first place.

In one of my favorite Garth Brooks songs, he "thanks God for unanswered prayers" because the life he lives is incredible and irreplaceable.

I love the idea of unanswered prayers. And I have thanked God many, many times for those unanswered ones. But there is one type of prayer I love even more: when God answers prayers we did not even know to pray. Matthew 21:22 says "Whatever you ask for in prayer with faith, you will receive." Now, though, I want to focus on the next part: what you ask for with faith. As a maturing Christian, I understand that having faith means that I pray not for what I want for myself, but what God would have for me.

Because I cannot comprehend the fullness of God's plan, I do not know how to pray for the things that lead me to that plan. Praying in faith is to surrender what I want to what God wants for me. These are the prayers that I do not yet know to pray.

In many ways, coming here to Rogersville is one of those prayers I did not yet know to pray. I was content in my appointment and did not plan to move. I had only thought of Rogersville United Methodist Church a few times in my entire life. I did not pray to come here because I never thought about being here. But I did pray for God's will to be done – I prayed for God to send me and that I would answer.

So, here I am in a place and a new life that I did not know to pray for. And I could not be happier! God brought us together and has created a path for us to walk that is known only to Him. Let's surrender to His will and go where He sends us. Let's hold as tightly as we can to the miracle that God is still working in our midst and still has great plans for our future. Let's offer up full and complete faith that God will work in us and among us so that we can bring life to the world. What a glorious adventure!


May God bless each of you. May He continue to pour out His love, mercy and grace upon the church and all of the ministries.
