As we continue in the waiting and preparing season of Lent, I turn often to John 8: 12. This verse tells one of the greatest and most powerful truths of our Savior. Jesus says “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.”

Jesus is the light of the world – what a miracle! No matter what darkness may creep into or over this world, the light of Jesus shines. In my office, I have some of those metal letters that spell the word, “Shine.” It is a reminder to me of many things. But even as I find myself leaning toward despair, I feel God’s hand so gently, lovingly, and patiently guiding me back to the light. We walk in the light of Jesus. Whoever follows the light of Jesus will never walk in darkness. Not MAY never... WILL never. We NEVER have to walk in darkness because we have the light.

Children of God, we do not just have light – we have the *light of life*. We follow, live in, and reflect the light of life. We do not have to accept the darkness because we have seen the light. And we are the ones who get to share that light with the world. What a priceless gift! We get to *have* the light of life and we get to *be* the light of life for others just as Jesus is for us. So, when you find yourself leaning toward despair, anger, fear, frustration, and the like when the world seems dark and ominous, look toward the light. It shined yesterday. It shines today. And it will shine tomorrow. Easter is coming, beloved children. Easter is coming. Amen.
