Dear Church Family,

Happy fall, y'all! I am so happy to see the end of those horrible 100+ degree days. I love all things fall – the nip in the air, changing leaves, and the sight of pumpkins and gourds making their seasonal debut.

As the seasons change, I think of God's mighty reminder in Acts 1: 7, "It is not for you to know the times or the seasons, which the Father hath put in his own power." I don't know about you, but patience has never been one of my strong suits. I'm getting better at it as I grow in faith – and in years – but I still struggle to surrender my plans and intentions to God's greater will.

In many ways for all of us, this entire year has been an exercise in patience. When we began to see changing schedules and closings, mandatory mask-wearing, and facing the reality of life outside the church building, many of us struggled to remain calm in the midst of so much uncertainty. We wanted Covid to be over ASAP. We set the end of March.... then May.... then September as the absolute end of our changed and disrupted schedules. We are impatient to "go back to normal" and don't want to think about this Covid-19 disruption continuing.

However, we now move into a fall season still marked by uncertainty as to how life will continue to unfold the rest of the year. Like many of you, I suspect that "normal" will need to be redefined in the days, weeks, and months to come. Sometimes, I do not want to have to think about redefining church and how we might be called to move and live differently in God's world. It is so hard to make decisions without all the facts and to surrender to the truth that things beyond our control dictate our lives in so many ways.

And yet, this is such an extraordinary chance to demonstrate our strong and resilient faith! It is not for us to know the seasons that God designs. Some of us impatiently wait for fall to arrive and some impatiently wait for summer to reappear – it's so hard for us humans to be satisfied, isn't it? Regardless of whether we love the arriving season or not, the seasons change right on God's schedule. I do not know why Covid-19 came into our lives. I do not think God sent it as punishment or to illustrate anger or judgment. I do believe that He is using this season to help us learn important things – patience, grace, wisdom. To remember how to pause and listen in silence to His still, quiet voice. To offer grace when things don't go our way. To wait in joy and trust instead of temper and frustration. To delight in the simple pleasures of God's beautiful creation.

This month and always, children of God, let's surrender ourselves to God's plan. Let's trust that things are unfolding as they must. Let's celebrate each other and delight in the presence of friends and family. Let's have a pumpkin spice latte, breathe in the crisp morning air, and allow God's plan to unfold in His time and at His pace. There is so much grace and beauty in the waiting.

Capital Improvement Fund	\$ 1,245.00


